

As we consider our gift for the Peace and Global Witness Offering, it is well to remember our relationship with the Koball's in Peru. They are on the front lines for bringing peace in Peru as they confront the people, companies and corrupt government that are robbing the Peruvian people of their natural resources and contaminating their families. Recent oil spills have contaminated beaches and wildlife which directly affects the health of the people living in communities close by. It also affects their livelihood since the fish are contaminated. Only a superficial clean-up followed the oil spill.

This is only one example of the "battles" that have been fought for the people of Peru by the Koballs and other Christian leaders. Mining has long been a source of contamination, especially to children. The lead levels surpass the approved levels by the World Health Organization.

We sometimes forget that even with all the things we consider to be wrong with our country, most places in the world have it much more difficult. "Freely we have received," so we must freely give.


