Advent 2023 - Come Home for Christmas



Advent is an invitation. For many, it is the invitation to get into that Christmas spirit, to count down the days to the grand celebration, and let the holiday transform everything around us.






Deacons collected and delivered 18 coats to FISH. Thank you!

Update from the Pastor Transition Task Force

At it's November meeting the Session heard the preliminary report from the Pastor Transition Task Force on the October mission discernment exercise. There were about thirty participants in the final "gleaning" meeting of this exercise that took place on October 22. And while this is a small percentage of our total church membership, it was felt that the input received was a good representation of the congregation. There were four central and common themes that emerged from this exercise where we can focus to grow in faithfulness.

Using our Talents/Gifts more fully

Engagement with/Outreach to the Community outside our congregation

Strengthening Fellowship within our congregation

Embracing Diversity of identities and needs within our congregation

In our last update we reported that the next step in our transition to new pastoral leadership would be to take the data gathered from our October discernment exercise and write our mission report. This report is the first key step in the process of calling a pastor. After reviewing the congregation's response to this exercise, the Session has determined that more discernment and input is needed before our mission report can be created. To this end a 12-week adult education series is being organized to begin as soon as possible after the Christmas holiday season. Each of the four themes would be the topic for three weeks and each week would be guided by a reflection question:

Week #1: What are we doing well?

Week #2: What could we do better?

Week #3: What kind of leadership do we need to get there?

These sessions will be another opportunity for the congregation to engage in the transition process through reflection, by being heard, and by listening and connecting with each other.


